INSTRUCTIONS FOR EXHIBITORS

In classes where no red is called for then pink and orange are to be considered as red. Please name your cultivars or number seedlings. Any artificial means of strengthening a stem will disqualify a bloom. The Society will supply vases and moss for all entries. Please turn your entry cards face down after staging your blooms.

Stewarding will be done by CHS members.

Premier Blooms may be awarded in all divisions and sub divisions and in all sections of the show depending on number of entries and quality of bloom.

DAFFODIL CLASSIFICATIONS



Division 1: Trumpet

One flower per stem; longer corona (ie trumpet) at least as long as the perianth segments (petals).



Division 8: Tazetta

Usually three to twenty flowers to a stout stem; perianth segments spreading not reflexed; flowers usually fragrant.



Division 2: Large Cupped

One flower per stem; shorter corona (ie cup) is more than 1/3, but less than equal to the length of the perianth segments (petals).



Division 9: Poeticus

Usually one flower to a stem; perianth pure white; corona very short or disc shaped; usually green and / or yellow centre and a red rim. Flowers usually fragrant.



Division 3: Small Cupped

One flower per stem; corona not more than one third the length of the perianth segments.



Division 10: Bulbocodium

Usually one flower per stem; perianth segments insignificant compared with dominant corona.



Division 4: Double

One or more flowers to a stem, with doubling of the perianth segments or corona or both.



Division 11: Split Corona

Corona split - usually for more than half its length.

- a.) Collar
- b.) Papillon



Division 5: Triandrus

Usually two or more pendant flowers to a stem; perianth segments reflexed.



Division 6: Cyclamineus

One flower to a stem; perianth segments significantly reflexed; flower at an acute angle to the stem with very short neck.



Division 7: Jonquilla

One to five flowers per stem; perianth segments spreading or reflexed; corona cup-shaped, funnel-shaped or flared, usually wider than long and fragrant.

Division 12: Other

Daffodil cultivars which do not fit into the definition of any of the other 11 divisions.

Colour codes

W - white or whitish

Y - yellow

G - green

R - red

P - pink

O - orange

When looking at a daffodil classification, the first number indicates the division of daffodil - Div 1 is a trumpet. The first letters represent the petal (perianth) colour, which may be more than one. The next group of letters represent the corona colour which again may be more than one. eg Div 1 y-gw = trumpet with yellow petals green centre and white corona.
